Breakout Sessions

Title: Pragmatic Conversations – Tentatively Scheduled

Description: FDOE leadership will facilitate this session.

Title: Professional Learning Updates

Description: The Florida State Board of Education adopted two rules on March 30, 2022, that impact professional learning. The first, Rule 6A-5.069, F.A.C., School District Professional Learning Systems, incorporates a new common template for school district use. The second, Rule 6A-5.071, F.A.C., Professional Learning Catalogs, incorporates updated language as a result of House Bill 7011 (2021). This session will cover the effects of the two rules as well as provide guidance to districts on utilizing the new professional learning system template.

Title: School Safety and Mental Health Legislation and Reporting

Description: This session will focus on state-level updates in school safety including the recently released Involuntary Examination & Restraint and Seclusion (IERS) system for reporting initiated involuntary examination data, the monthly collection of School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) data, changes to school safety requirements in recent legislation, and new revisions to Rule 6A-1.0018, F.A.C., School Safety Requirements, and Monitoring. The presentation will include a discussion on compliance challenges observed through district monitoring as well as suggested resolutions/remediations.

Title: Literacy in Florida: What You Need to Know

Description: This session will highlight Florida's literacy initiatives and policies as the building blocks to increase student achievement. Florida is building a foundation for success to support students, educators, and families. Join this session to learn about and discuss the fundamental steps for continuous improvement of education in Florida.

Title: Leveraging After-School and Summer Learning Programs

Description: This session will address how expanded learning opportunities such as after-school and summer learning can be used to support student achievement and family engagement. Topics to be covered include the benefits of after-school and summer learning, funding sources that can be used for expanded learning opportunities, and existing resources that can be leveraged and adapted to provide high-quality enrichment during expanded learning time. The goal of this session is to highlight the resources available to schools through our federal Title funding, ARP funding, and state-funded community organizations that can be leveraged to drive student achievement.

Title: How the Bureau of School Improvement Can Support Your District

Description: School districts will learn about the role of the Bureau of School Improvement in assisting them with creating sustainable systems for lasting school improvement. In addition, key requirements, grant eligibility, timelines, and resources will be reviewed.

Title: Florida Civics Literacy Excellence Initiative Resources

Description: This session will highlight Florida's goal to be the national leader in civics education, and will provide updates, including projected timelines, for all of the projects associated with the Florida Civics Literacy Excellence Initiative.

Title: Health Education Resources

Description: This session will provide updates on recent Florida Department of Education work on Substance Use and Abuse Education and Resiliency, which are components of the Health Education curriculum and required instruction in Florida. Participants will review content from the Required Instruction Reporting Portal used to provide information on statewide instruction on Substance Use and Abuse. They will learn about the new state standards for Substance Use and Abuse and their connection with the overall district system of care. Finally, participants will receive an overview of the resources in *The Facts. Your Future. School Assemblies Toolkit* and *Florida's Resiliency Toolkit*.

Title: All Things Career and Technical Education

Description: The Career and Technical Education team will review implementation updates from prior legislation with House Bill 1507 and the REACH Act. Updates and reminders will be provided for programs and processes including CAPE, new programs, and 2022 legislation. An update on the CTE Audit will also be provided.

Title: Exceptional Student Education Updates

Description: This session will provide updated statewide data specific to students with disabilities; legislative and policy updates specific to exceptional student education; updates to the state performance plan for exceptional student education, including LEA Profile data and district determination criteria; and a review of dispute resolution, including most common issues in state complaints and due process findings, and a review of best practices for alternatives to dispute resolution.

Title: Serving Students in Dropout Prevention Programs and Alternative Schools
